## Background

Fully Funded Writing Workshops for West African-based Early Career Women Researchers.

Are you a woman early career researcher from a West African country who has completed a PhD in Humanities and Social Sciences within the last five years? Then this call is for you! The Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST) in Kumasi, Ghana, in partnership with the University of East Anglia in the UK, is pleased to announce a programme of writing workshops sponsored by the British Academy, for sixteen (16) fully funded early career women based in the ECOWAS zone.

Selected researchers will have the opportunity to travel to Ghana to participate in two (2) writing workshops in a serene lodge surrounded by nature, where they will be mentored by eight (8) leading scholars in the Humanities and Social Sciences to produce a cutting-edge peer-reviewed article. The mentoring will continue over the next 14 months of the programme to ensure that the participants publish an article in a high-quality academic journal and receive training in applying for funding.

## Eligibility

- Early-career West Africa based women researchers who have finished their PhD in the last five years, of all ages, in all disciplines of the Social Sciences and Humanities.
- Early career women who have published at least two peer-reviewed articles in recognised high-impact scientific journals are NOT eligible.

## Timetable

- 11 September 2023, the deadline for applications.
- 21 September 2023, the announcement of selected candidates.
- 30 September 2023, the deadline to confirm attendance.
- 18-23 December 2023 First residential workshop will be held at the Nyansapo Eco Resort, Moree in Ghana.
- August 2024: Second residential workshop at a lodge in Ghana
- April 2025: Zoom public seminar to present papers resulting from the workshop to a wider audience.

- Draft an article of a minimum of 2500 words and a maximum of 8000 words. Drafts must include:
  - i) Introduction
  - ii) Objectives
  - iii) Methodology
  - iv) Sources on which you base your analysis
  - v) References. The name of the draft article file should include your name.
- Shortlisted candidates will be asked to submit 2 recommendation letters.
